



Year 1 Learning Journey

Week beginning: 13th January 2020



This week our English lessons will continue to be linked to Toy Story.

The children will be rehearsing the story we have read in class before retelling in both verbal then written form.

Throughout their story writing we will be continuing to focus on sentence structure and ensuring they have remembered to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Some children will be encouraged to include adjectives and conjunctions in their writing too.

This week in Maths our lessons will focus on number and place value.

This week the children will learning how to partition 2 digit numbers into tens and ones. This is an important, and often tricky, concept to understand in Year One so it is an area we revisit often.

The children will be reading a number to 20 and then saying how many tens are in the number and how many ones.

Towards the end of the week we will be using addition to show partitioning
e.g. $14 = 10 + 4$

Phonics sounds of the week:

We will be learning 3 new graphemes

ea, oy, ir

Key words of the week:

Put are

Please note the children are expected to be able to read and spell these words by the end of Year 1.

Morning Routine

You may have noticed that the children now have morning job books and are completing a written activity (handwriting or maths) between 8:45-8:55am.

This will be the structure for the rest of the year. The tasks we provide are aimed at being completed independently and we would appreciate your support in allowing the children the opportunity to do this on their own.

In order to promote the children's independence, please drop your child off at the main door to the infants or the classroom door. We ask you **not** to enter the classroom of a morning from now on. The class teacher will be at the door should you need to pass on any messages.

Toys

This half term we are using toys as a stimulus in our English lessons. Next week we would like your child to bring in a toy from home. We will be playing with the toys and writing about them.

We ask that the toy can stay in school for a couple of weeks so nothing too expensive or precious please. It needs to be a toy that you child won't mind staying in school for a while.
