Home Challenge

For this week's home challenge, we would love your support in helping your child draw a picture inspired by the story.

Encourage your child to add some writing or sounds to label their picture, if appropriate. This might be as simple as talking about why Goldilocks might be sorry, or having a go at writing some initial sounds from the names of the characters (e.g., B for Bear, G for Goldilocks).

Please support your child at a level that suits them best—whether that's drawing and discussing the story together or attempting some early writing.

How you can help at home

- ✓ Keep practising daily with their sounds. Can they write the sounds?
- ✓ Go on a sound hunt around the house - what objects can you find that start with the sounds learnt?
- ✓ Continue looking for numbers. Can you find them on doors, shops, around the home, on the way to school?

Phonemes we will be focusing on this week in school -



Pronunciation Phrase - h

Open your lips a little; put your teeth on your bottom lip and push the air out to make the sound **ffff ffff**



Pronunciation Phrase - b

Open your mouth a little; put your tongue up to the top of your mouth, behind your teeth, and press **llll**



Pronunciation Phrase - f

Open your lips a little; put your teeth on your bottom lip and push the air out to make the sound **ffff ffff**



Pronunciation Phrase - l

Open your mouth a little; put your tongue up to the top of your mouth, behind your teeth, and press **llll**

We will be orally blending words. *Can you hear the phonemes in these words? Can you listen and then repeat the word?*
