

 Punctuation - Use capital letters, full stops and introduce

 The Hare and the Tortoise- Sequence story and retell the story.
 The Three Little Pigs- Character description and sentence to retell the story

Mathematics
 Number and place value
 Count in multiples of 2's,5's and 10's
 Addition- number bonds to 10 then 20
 Subtraction- taking away one and two digit numbers to 20
 Measurement- comparing heavier/lighter, time

 Geometry- recognising and describing 3D shapes.
