Phonemes we will be focusing on this week in school -



Pronunciation Phrase - v

Put your teeth against your bottom lip and make a buzzing sound www



Pronunciation Phrase - w

Pucker your lips and keep them small as you say **w w w**



Pronunciation Phrase - x

Mouth open, then push the cs/x sound through as you close your mouth cs cs cs (x x x)



Pronunciation Phrase - y

Smile, tongue to the top of your mouth; say **y** without opening your mouth **yyy**

We will be reading and writing words. Can you spot segment and blend these words and spot this week's phonemes?

van vet wet wig fox six yes yum

We will be reading sentences. Can you spot any tricky words? Can you segment and blend the words and look out for this week's phonemes?

A fox is red. I had a big wig.
