How to help at home

To help improve gross motor skills

Draw large flowers and plants on the ground and walls outside with chalks.

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Use watering cans or other large containers to 'water' the chalk plants and wash them away.

To help improve fine motor skills

Display a vase of flowers and get the children to paint them with watercolours/draw them.

Make salt dough insects that would be found in the garden.

Or

Plant sunflower seeds. Water them and watch them grow

To help improve number recognition

Find the number 2 on your walk home, or when you go to the shops. Where can you find it? On number plates, on houses, on price tickets, etc
